Task 1


Choose a key moment in your book and change an event or character. How would that impact the plot of the book?

- Research old folk songs and gospel songs like those mentioned in the novel. What part do traditional songs and music play in the role of a community?






<u>Grammar</u>

Don't forget that you can practice your times tables, by logging into the times tables rock stars website. See if you can get yourself to the top of the leader board or better yet: Beat your teachers!








Science

History



This half term, the children will be learning about why the Empire Windrush was important in British history. Windrush Day is celebrated on the 22nd June each year. It is a special day to commemorate the first generation of people invited to the UK from British colonies such as Jamaica, Trinidad and Tobago to help rebuild Britain after the Second World War. On Windrush Day, the Windrush Generation and their descendants are honoured and their contributions to British society remembered.

- Imagine that you are going to interview one of the people arriving on the Empire Windrush, a boat that brought many Caribbean migrants to the UK. You will need to prepare questions and carry out research to find out the answers.
- Imagine what it was like for someone making the journey on Empire Windrush. How would they have felt as they waved goodbye? What did they think life would be like in their new country? What did they do on the journey? What was their first glimpse of Britain like? Decide on how to convey your thoughts and emotions through either a letter, diary or personal account.





<u>Art</u>

This half term we will be learning about the artistic style of impressionism and incorporating that style to the concept of memories.
