Dear Families,

At Foxfield, we view homework as a means to reinforce learning in the classroom, with a key focus on nurturing the joy of reading. We encourage parents and carers to ensure children are reading for pleasure every day. Reading is the single most important activity children can do at home. In addition, we ask that parents and carers support children in practising essential skills which are fundamental to their learning, including arithmetic, multiplication tables and phonics.

Occasionally, your child may be given an additional, short task designed to consolidate and extend a key skill that they have recently learned in class. This measured approach ensures home learning is meaningful, manageable, and supports a healthy balance between school and home life.
